"Jesus and Our Longing for Encouragement" First in the Series, "Light in the Darkness: Jesus and our Deepest Longings" **Steve Watson**

What the prophets teach us at Christmastime:

- 1. God <u>sees</u> and <u>feels</u> and <u>responds</u> to our longings and our needs.
- 2. God is both <u>smaller</u> and <u>bigger</u> than we'd tend to assume.

How can Jesus encourage me this month?

- 1. Go back to seventh grade: it's OK that you want to be seen, known, and responded to.
- 2. <u>Complain</u>, <u>complain</u> again, and <u>pray</u>. <u>Repeat</u> as needed.
- 3. <u>Remember</u> any signs that God is <u>on the scene</u>.
- 4. <u>Eat courage</u> for breakfast.
- 5. When <u>encouragement</u> comes, <u>write</u> a <u>song</u> about it.

Habakkuk 1:2-4 (NRSV)

O LORD, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save? ³ Why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. ⁴ So the law becomes slack and justice never prevails. The wicked surround the righteous—therefore judgment comes forth perverted.

Habakkuk 1:12-2:1 (NRSV)

¹² Are you not from of old, O LORD my God, my Holy One?

You shall not die. O LORD, you have marked them for judgment;

and you, O Rock, have established them for punishment. ¹³ Your eyes are too pure to behold evil, and you cannot look on wrongdoing; why do you look on the treacherous, and are silent when the wicked swallow those more righteous than they? ¹⁴ You have made people like the fish of the sea, like crawling things that have no ruler. ¹⁵ The enemy brings all of them up with a hook; he drags them out with his net, he gathers them in his seine; so he rejoices and exults.

¹⁶ Therefore he sacrifices to his net and makes offerings to his seine; for by them his portion is lavish, and his food is rich.

¹⁷ Is he then to keep on emptying his net, and destroying nations without mercy? ² I will stand at my watchpost, and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what he will say to me, and what he will answer concerning my complaint.

Habakkuk 2:12-14 (NRSV)

"Alas for you who build a town by bloodshed, and found a city on iniquity!" ¹³ Is it not from the LORD of hosts that peoples labor only to feed the flames, and nations weary themselves for nothing? ¹⁴ But the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea.

Habakkuk 2:2-4 (NRSV)

Then the LORD answered me and said:

Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. ³ For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end, and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay. ⁴ Look at the proud! Their spirit is not right in them, but the righteous live by their faith.

Habakkuk 3:17-19 (NRSV)

Though the fig tree does not blossom, and no fruit is on the vines; though the produce of the olive fails, and the fields yield no food; though the flock is cut off from the fold, and there is no herd in the stalls, ¹⁸ yet I will rejoice in the LORD; I will exult in the God of my salvation. ¹⁹ GOD, the Lord, is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, and makes me tread upon the heights. To the leader: with stringed instruments.
