

A NEW LOOK FOR SUMMER

The weather is still chilly but summer is just around the corner! This year summer at Reservoir Church will look a little different than it has in the past—hopefully in ways that will fit with your schedule and provide even more opportunities for connection! Read on for details of programs, dates, and special events.

PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN

Our post-Easter series about Jesus' resurrection appearances culminates with the Story of Pentecost which falls on June 4 this year. Then we'll have time for a couple of stories about Peter and Paul before a short summer break.

Our 5-week summer series that begins on July 16 will explore sheep and shepherds, together one of the key metaphors in the Bible. We'll learn about King David who began as a shepherd, challenge ourselves to learn Psalm 23 ("The Lord is my shepherd"), remember the shepherds from the nativity story, and hear the parable of the Good Shepherd. Alongside our usual Bible storytelling, we'll explore some nature, science, and geography facts about sheep and see what we can make with wool. We may even raise money for Heifer Project.

ELEMENTARY

In May the Elementary group is finishing up a unit on Acts of the Apostles. Acts is full of great stories of courage, adventure, and Holy Spirit power. We'll be sharing a few of those stories in large group, and the kids are getting the chance to explore some of the others as they work on creating illustrations for our own Acts book project. Besides exposure to the stories, the project is also giving the kids some practice finding things in the Bible! In June we'll wrap up the school year by celebrating Pentecost and the Holy Spirit with a little extra worship (and maybe some treats).

Over the 5-week summer session we'll be talking about the five core values of Reservoir Church: Connection, Everyone, Action, Freedom, and Humility. We'll hear stories that illustrate concrete aspects of each value, and talk about how they affect the kids' experience of church—and offer them tools for their lives outside of church. As we've done the past few years, we'll also be changing up the structure of our mornings a little bit to give the kids a chance to work together across age groups—and also to play together out on the playground!

YOUTH GROUP

In April we began our spring focus on justice by joining up with a few projects hosted by Reservoir in the City. Many of our youth and families joined community members in bringing personal hygiene items for refugee youth living in the foster care system in Massachusetts and packing them in new duffle bags on May 6.

We've been baking lots of goodies in youth group! We baked about a dozen trays of cookies to honor educators at the Banneker and Peabody, two neighborhood schools with whom we partner through Reservoir in the City. On Mother's Day and Father's Day, we are excited to offer a cafe where moms and dads can receive a blessing and a sweet treat.

Our biggest social action project is to raise \$1000 for the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life. Soon, we'll celebrate our graduating seniors with a special spiritual send-off dinner where important people in each senior's life are invited to celebrate their senior and pray blessing, life and encouragement for the transition to their next venture.

Our 5-week summer series will be about finding God in nature. We hope to be out in nature as often as possible, taking trips to Walden Pond, biking on trails, and climbing mountains.
