PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN

We're hearing stories about Jesus' resurrection appearances to his friends this spring. I was intrigued by a recent essay in the WSJ entitled "The Easter Effect and How It Changed the World." The author, George Weigel, ponders how "a ragtag band of nobodies from the far edges of the Mediterranean world" could grow into a dominant religion in just two and half centuries. The ragtag group insisted that it was because Jesus had risen from the dead. Weigel remarks, "One of the most striking things about the New Testament accounts of Easter, and what followed in the days immediately after Easter, is that the Gospel writers and editors carefully preserved the memory of the first Christians' bafflement, skepticism and even fright about what had happened to their former teacher and what was happening to them." They lived daring lives because they became convinced that death "did not have the final word in the human story." We'll be looking at some of those puzzling first encounters with the risen Jesus in Kids Church this month. May the resurrection of Jesus empower us all to dare to live with hope and freedom especially as we confront the dark places of our world and of our own hearts.

YOUTH GROUP

As we transition from the season of Lent, the Reservoir Church youth group is turning its gaze outward. Middle and high schoolers are raising money for the American Cancer Society through Relay for Life, organized by senior Ren MacLean. Through a series of bake sales and other fundraising endeavors, our young people hope to raise \$1000 for cancer research and patient resources. The spring will also include a time of retelling Jesus' stories to younger Reservoir kids and some fun adventures. Relay for Life, rock-climbing, and a video game tournament are just a few of the events on the upcoming Reservoir Youth calendar.

ELEMENTARY

Back in March the elementary group wrapped up our Lent unit with an interactive dramatic reading of the Holy Week story performed by the fourth and fifth graders. Now we're backing up in the story, and will spend the seven Sundays between Easter and Memorial Day talking about Jesus and God's kingdom. We'll be hearing some things that Jesus had to say about what God wants for the world, from the Sermon on the mount, and from the thoughts he shared with his friends during their last meal together. We'll also look at how Jesus acted to bring the kingdom about through simple things like sharing food and noticing the people around him. The unit will wrap up with a celebration of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost!
