Who needs shelter from loss?

Stand in the rain. Listen to it.

As your face and hair begin to get wet Say a prayer in the rain

Drought can be harsh and greedy.

Who needs shelter from abuse?

Who needs shelter from injustice?

Who needs shelter from being othered?

Stand among the drought.

Feel the high heat of the day. Say a prayer in the drought (real needs of real people)

Rain can cause damage and ruin things beyond repair.

Who is sleeping outside in the rain after being evicted?

Who is sleeping outside in the rain because it is safer than being at home?

Who is sleeping outside in the rain as they seek asylum in a forigne land?

Stand in the rain.

Listen to it.

As your shoes start to get soggy and cold Say a prayer in the rain

Drought dries up land. It can leave the soil cracked and lacking nourishment.

Who has lost their job and is watching their savings run dry?

Who has planted good seed but their pantry is bare because the drought thwarted the harvest?

Who has lost their sense of direction because the land looks so unrecognizable?

Stand among the drought.

Look up and squint at the strength of the sun. Say a prayer in the drought

Who needs shelter?

What questions do the rain and drought bring forward for you?
