

A K-6 SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY ENGINEERING & MATHEMATICS SCHOOL

Summary

The **Director of Special Education** is a member of the school's leadership team and reports directly to the Executive Director with responsibility for planning, directing, and coordinating the delivery of school-wide special education and related services in compliance with state regulations and federal laws. The Director of Special Education provides leadership and coordination to ensure the overall design and implementation of individualized educational programs and support services that provide Banneker students with the support needed to grow in academic skill and social emotional awareness.

The **Director of Special Education** will lead a team of motivated teachers that supports our community, offering services to students (English Language Learning, Speech Pathology, OT, PT), and managing the SPED Assessment team.

The **Director of Special Education** organizes professional development on specific topics related to serving students in a culturally affirming way, in support of their social emotional learning and with a vision of the students abilities rather than deficits. As an advocate for students with special needs, the Director of Special Education will engage with parents, teachers, students and school leaders on matters related to serving each student's needs.

The **Director of Special Education** will contribute to the overall culture of the school as a collaborative agent of change committed to progressive school improvement and meeting the needs of all students in a rigorous academic environment.

About the Banneker

The Benjamin Banneker Charter Public School, located in Cambridge, is celebrating 25 years of educating children in Massachusetts. From the start, in 1996, community leaders and parents knew that there had to be a better way to provide students with a culturally affirming yet rigorous education. Their objective in creating such a school was to ensure that students would leave the Banneker with a culturally rich and academically strong foundation that would provide a path for future success. After 25 years of building and refining, the Banneker continues to deliver on its promises, and is recognized for excellent academic outcomes, where students also gain self esteem and favorably view their school experience. The program's design is rigorous yet agile and ever-evolving. The results have been well validated, with overall proficiency scores of nearly 20 percentage points above the Massachusetts state averages for ELA, Math, and Science.

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Key Responsibilities for the Director of Special Education (included, but not limited to):

- Assists in the development and implementation of the school's accountability plan and is responsible for meeting special education goals
- Coordinates all aspects of the special education process including referral, evaluation, disability determination and IEP development in accordance with state regulations and federal laws
- Performs academic assessments, observes students, writes formal reports and makes recommendations
- Chairs all IEP meetings and serves as primary district representative authorized to commit district resources at IEP meetings
- Facilitates compliance of legal regulations by ensuring students are receiving services in accordance to IEP and in the least restrictive environment
- Observes all timelines for completion of evaluation, team meetings and service delivery as mandated by state regulations and federal laws
- Ensures the maintenance of accurate student records
- Chairs Coordinated Program Review conducted by DESE
- Interviews, supervises, trains and directs the work of all special education professionals and related service staff
- Contracts with outside agencies for related services
- Serves as primary liaison between agencies that provide support to students
- Evaluates the performance of all special education professionals and related service staff
- Oversees the development and coordination of curriculum goals and objectives and distribution of instructional material for special education programs
- Provides technical assistance to school staff in areas of high standards for students with disabilities including differentiated instruction techniques
- Maintains responsive lines of communication among students, parents and staff
- Organizes and conducts kindergarten screening as part of "Child Find."
- Collaborates with all program and support areas in the school to ensure a unified model of service delivery and the appropriate inclusion of special education in all academic and non-academic activities
- Develops and implements integrative/inclusive programs, working with school leadership and outside agencies to evaluate and monitor their effectiveness in terms of quality service to students with disabilities
- Assumes a lead role in the professional development activities of special education and regular education teachers to improve instruction for all special education students
- Prepares grants to obtain special education federal funding
- Performs other related duties as requested by the Executive Director
